ICE (In Case of Emergency)

MODA has learned that your cell phone can now be a useful tool for Emergency providers (Police and Fire) in the event of an accident. The first responders will look thru your cell phone's address list for the initials ICE in hopes of contacting the nearest family members or designated emergency contact. This newest and useful tool will provide quicker contact in the event that the cell phone use is unable to tell first responders who to call. Take the time to pickup your cell phones and program in your emergency contact's phone number under ICE. It just may save your life. Take it a step further and program ICE OUT with your out of state contact in the event of a earthquake.

Message From Our President

Where did the summer go? It seems like yesterday we just had the picnic. But by now, everybody has settled into the new school year while our fabulous weather continues. As the day light hours shrink, I start to think about getting ready for colder weather and planning holiday activities. But alas, there is the yard work and house repairs along with the resumption of MODA activities. In fact, the newsletter is coming a little later than normal and mostly because I like many others have been extremely busy.

Tree maintenance is a huge issue that is easy to notice when you walk around the neighborhood. I spent a solid weekend going through my canopy of seven oaks trees around my yard last year, a job I do not recommend for those afraid of heights, and can still see areas where I need to do more work to take some of the weight off the longer limbs. I plan on having an arborist take a look at one of my trees to see what I can do about the branches that are sagging on SBC lines. It's a good thing we don't get many days of high wind but I don't want to wait for the inevitable to happen either.

I also started thinking about disaster preparation and enrolled myself into the CERT course. I and others in the neighborhood are learning about how to perform certain tasks to help out in a mass conflagration. Let's face it, it isn't a matter of what will happen, but rather when. Do you know how to shut off your gas if you smell it? When was the last time you checked your fire extinguisher(s)? Do you have a first aid kit in your car? I would like to believe we won't get flooded like the effects seen in the aftermath of Katrina, but I do wonder about how I would get home if I was at work and a major earthquake hit. One thing I wonder about is if the bay area gets hit hard, will the peninsula be the place to be if any one or all of the bridges go out? Can we survive for a week or more in our neighborhood with out any outside re-supply or relief if we had to? It brings back memories of bomb shelters in the mid west back during the cold war years.

Morbid thoughts I realize but questions none the less that are being asked in the wake of the events in the south from this past summer. The bottom line is could we ever be ready and what more can you and I do? We hope it never happens but that is of course unrealistic. Coleman Traffic Monitors

It is this time of year again! Children are back to Laurel every morning. Over one hundred Laurel families are using the Coleman avenue again either driving, biking or walking. A Laurel school survey last year showed that a lot more families would like to bike to Laurel, even occasionally. However, the majority of the responses to the school survey expressed a great concern for safety on Coleman, and a lot more families would leave their car in the garage if something was done to make them feel safer.

Neighbors of the Menlo Oaks neighborhood organized a traffic watch and survey over the last two weeks of school last June. The mere presence of these friendly observers posted at the corner of Coleman and Menlo Oaks resulted in an unexpected decrease in speed and improved the behavior of both drivers and bikers. Since making changes to Coleman is a complex issue that will not be resolved quickly, a "traffic watch" pilot program will be tested for two months from November to December 2005. We are looking for volunteers to stand at the corner of Coleman and Menlo Oaks once a month or once a week from 8AM to 8:15AM on school days. By taking turn slowing down traffic in the morning, we can make the street feel safer for all of us during the peak morning rush.

Getting Ready for the Big One

In the event of a major disaster our emergency services will be overwhelmed, and we will need to be able to cope without them for at least seventy two hours, if not a week or two. The CERT program trains volunteers to assist their neighbors until fire, police, medical and other emergency services are available. Since September 14 four of your neighbors have been training on Wednesday nights to better prepare themselves for a major disaster in our community. There are also two additional neighbors who have completed the training.

Rich Collyer, Joel Wilhite, Charles Riley and Rob Riley are enrolled in a program called CERT -- Community Emergency Response Team -- which is being conducted free of charge by the Menlo Park Fire District. The other agencies participating in training the volunteers are the Menlo Park, East Palo Alto and Atherton police departments. This comprehensive training consists of six sessions of approximately 2 1/2 hours each. The topics covered are:

- * Earthquake Awareness, Preparedness and Hazard Mitigation
- * Basic Disaster Skills
- * Medical
- * Light Search and Rescue
- * Team Organization and Management

* Skills Development and Application

The Menlo Park Fire District currently has free CERT training sessions scheduled three times in 2006.

March 9 - April 13 at the Menlo Park City Council Chambers

April 26 - May 31 at the Ravenswood Family Health Center

September 21 - October 26 at the Menlo Park City Council Chambers
