## ANNUAL MEETING

The MODA board is faced with significantly increasing costs involved in putting on the annual meeting. The two facilities we have talked to about renting space (Pennisula & Laurel) require the signing of a contract that requires us to indemnify the school and have a \$1,000,000 insurance policy. The cost of the insurance is \$383 this year. The cost to rent Pennisula is \$50. This has a fairly significant impact on the MODA budget. Some of the options we are considering, and need to talk about at this years meeting, are:

- 1) move the meeting to someone's home
- 2) move the time and date to a time when we can have the meeting outdoors
- 3) Up the dues to cover the cost

# Misc. News

## “Safe Routes to School”

There was a public meeting for the Safe Routes issue at Laurel School on October 3. It was very well attended by neighbors from Menlo Oaks.

The major announcement made at that meeting was that the Coleman Ave. issue is going to be tabled for now. The members of the steering committee have requested a meeting with the residents living on Coleman. The meeting has been delayed and postponed because of scheduling conflicts that the members of the steering committee have. Coleman can't be addressed in this go-around because the Safe Routes plan is scheduled to be presented to the City Council on November 3 (see you there?).

The consultants to the City of Menlo Park, Kimley Horn and Associates, presented a 29 point recommendation of changes to the area around Laurel School. The recommendations range from narrowing the westbound (toward Middlefield) travel lane of Ringwood from 11 feet to 10 feet in order to improve bike and parking along that side to creating several lighted crosswalks like we have at Ravenswood and Alma. If you want a full digest of the 29 points look at the MODA web site. Attendees of the meeting had an opportunity to give input to the points. We broke into small discussion groups that had a representative from either the City or Kimley Horn.

Before the plan goes to the Council, it will be presented to both the Transportation Commission and the Bike Commission. Non-commission members may attend the meetings but are not welcomed to contribute to the discussion.

There are still many questions still unanswered:

- The number of people/children who would be using the bike lane/pathway
- Who would be responsible for upkeep of the bike lane/pathway
- Who would pay for the installation of the bike lane/pathway

- Would the bike lane/pathway meet ADA standards? ADA standards bring to light a whole new issue.

- Can a bike lane/pathway legally be installed that doesn't meet ADA standards?

## Menlo Oaks Bunco Group Starting!

What's Bunco? It's a fast, fun and super easy dice game that is really just a means to meet and talk to your neighbors on a monthly basis. It's a game played by ladies groups in communities all over the country. We are hoping to get a Women's Bunco Group started this fall. Here is what's involved:

- We'll need 16 people plus some subs to get started.

- Hostess is responsible for providing 4 tables to play at, small bowls of finger food for each table (chips, M&Ms and such) and some drinks. The group can decide on how to handle wine purchases. You'll only do it every year and a half or so.

- Participants need to be able to roll three dice at once and talk at the same time.

The board is made up of people who have lived in MO from 1960 to people who have been here for just a couple of years. We all mentioned the rural aspect of our neighborhood; the oak trees in our yards and in the middle of some streets, the winding nature of some of the streets and, of course, the beloved pothole ;-).

We bought in MO in 1975 because it was near to SRI and because it reminded us of the Midwestern rural areas we had grown up in. We wanted a dog and so felt that we needed a large backyard for that. My husband also likes to cut the grass himself! Our house is on a flag lot so we truly love the sense of privacy that gives us.

We also liked the fact that each house wasn't a cookie cutter sample of the rest of the houses in the neighborhood. No one ever says how their house is just like their neighbor's except that the floor plan is just reversed.
